GOD IS MOVING IN CAPE MAY!

In 2021 and 2022, Cape Community Church has become a hive of activity for the church and the community. For years, we have been the Warming Center for Middle Township, and this past January, we stayed open for the homeless during a major snowstorm for three days. What an opportunity to show the love of Jesus! January was easily the coldest month since we moved here and we had many opportunities to build relationships, watch people move into their next home, and find employment. It was a mutual blessing for our guests and our volunteers!

We have also been blessed with new ministry partners!

- **Deeply Rooted** - We have begun hosting a homeschool co-op at the church that serves over 350 families. This has added so much life to the church during the week with little feet running around and it is great for the community to see how much is happening at CCC!
- **Child Evangelism Fellowship** - We will soon be hosting summer Backyard Clubs. Our prayer is for Good News Clubs to begin in the local schools where children need to hear the saving message of the gospel.
- **Iglesia Evangelica Cristiana Redimidos Por Gracia** - While we prayed about how best to utilize our beautiful chapel while worshiping in the Family Center, we were contacted by Pastor Gilberto Mercado and his new Spanish language congregation that was looking for a space to meet on Saturday night. We were thrilled to be able to offer the chapel and this past Christmas Eve, we enjoyed worship and fellowship together as one congregation with a candlelight service. We hope to worship and fellowship together more often in the years to come!

Prayer Walks - Our Prayer Walk Ministry has continued through the pandemic and has presented the gospel to hundreds of lost people in Cape May Court House and Rio Grande. We've had opportunity to pray with local police and firefighters. We also walk at the motels in the winter, handing out coats, shoes, and care bags for the homeless staying there. It has become a visible representation of his hands and feet in Cape May!
