Bringing you up to date!

Many years ago when I was single in the late 1980's, I spent a year helping plant a church in Istanbul, Turkey. Since then I married Renee, raised a family with her, finished seminary, and just recently retired from Verizon after twenty-seven years. Now that we are empty nesters, we believe the Lord is calling us to help plant a church, much closer this time, in Chestertown, on Maryland's Eastern Shore. Istanbul is near the ancient Biblical port of Troas where Paul received a vision of a Man in Macedonia asking for help (Acts 16). Paul concluded that God wanted them to cross the Aegean Sea and preach the gospel there. God has shown me today that there is a desire for help in Chestertown, Maryland. This means I will need to cross the Chesapeake Bay to preach the gospel there.



How did this happen?

About five years ago as I was finishing my last seminary class at

Reformed Theological Seminary in Washington D.C., I began seriously searching for a ministry I could join that was in line with my gifts and abilities and was also doctrinally compatible. To make a long story short, I discovered the Bible Fellowship Church, a reformed denomination in the mid-Atlantic area. I found this group of churches not only to be serious about God's word, but they also emphasized evangelism, discipleship, and growing new churches through their church planting department, Church Exten-



sion Ministries. After going through the application process with the denomination, I learned there was a need for an Assistant Church Planter at Grace Community Church which is the first church of the denomination in Maryland. Here is a map showing Westminster, where we now live, and Chestertown.

Grace Community Today!

Our church has a name: Grace Community Church. It is rare among church plants in

that it already has its own building with worship sanctuary, multiple classrooms, and kitchen. James and Mindy Reff and their four children have been there several years laboring even through some difficult COVID days. There has been an ongoing youth archery ministry for a couple of years. A youth ministry recently started. Each Sunday morning an adult Sunday School class is held and a worship service that averages 30 people. There is a midweek service. There is an administrative team in place as well as a Transitional Leadership Team consisting of elders and pastors from other churches. Once Grace Community develops its own elders, this team will be disbanded.

Our goal is to help this church graduate from church plant status into a self-sustaining church. I will be sharing some of the preaching on Sundays, developing adult Bible studies and small group ministry, outreach in the community, and assisting James where needed.
