


Mark Morrison Prayer Letter

Coming in for a landing...

I began as a church planter back in the mid -1970's. The mission church was located in rural Nebraska over 150 miles from the nearest city of any size. My regional superintendent would come to visit me in his small airplane. At times I rode with him to get a "bird's eye view" of the area. It was on one of these flights that he explained the importance of a soft landing.



Now that over 45 years have passed, I am thinking about a "soft landing," as retirement is beginning to appear just over the horizon. My passion for planting new churches has not waned. However, my involvement will be changing.
